

# Glasgow

17 – 21 June 2010



Since it became the European City of Culture in 1990, Glasgow has undergone a lengthy transformation, evident along the River Clyde and the recent restoration of the magnificent Kelvingrove Art Gallery. The city grew up around the cathedral founded by St Mungo in the 6th century and in 1451 the University was founded. Its reputation has rested on its heavy industries, its tenement blocks and its poverty, but to an art lover it has extremely rich treasures, in the form of exciting architecture by Alexander 'Greek' Thomson, Robert Adam, Charles Rennie Mackintosh, and well-known artworks of exceptional quality in 3 superb museums - Kelvingrove, The Burrell Collection and The Hunterian.

Our programme will be a full one to include buildings by Mackintosh (with a visit to Hill House in Helensburgh) and visits to the Cathedral and museums.
